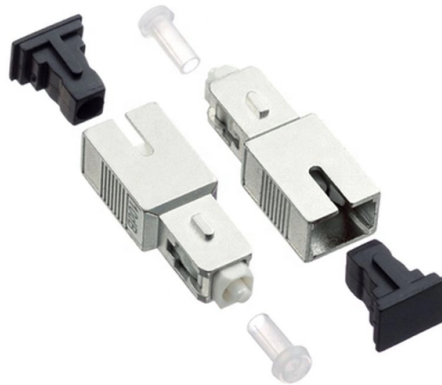


Additional tariffs imposed on optical communication products

Recent U.S. tariffs on optical products range from 10% to over 55%, depending on the country of origin and product type, significantly affecting supply chains and costs.

Overview of Recent Tariff Measures

The U.S. government has implemented a series of reciprocal and country-specific tariffs on optical products, including frames, lenses, eyewear accessories, and optical transceivers. An Executive Order issued on April 2, 2025, imposed a 10% global reciprocal tariff on all imports entering the U.S., effective April 5, 2025, in addition to any existing tariffs or special duties. These tariffs are layered on top of prior Section 301 tariffs, which historically targeted Chinese imports and ranged from 7.5% to 25%.

Country-Specific Tariff Rates

China: Optical products face a separate tariff adjustment scheduled for August 12, 2025, with rates reported to be upwards of 55% for certain items, including eyeglass frames and cases. Total duties on some Chinese optical products may reach 27.5% to 33.5%, while specialized items like reinforced plastic eyeglass cases can face 50% to 65%.

Other Trade Partners: Tariffs on imports from Asia, Eastern Europe, and Africa range from 25% to 40%, with some countries subject to 15% to 41% depending on the product category. Countries not specifically listed incur a 10% reciprocal tariff.

USMCA Countries: Goods covered under the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement generally remain tariff-free, though some lens imports from Mexico are affected by new duties.
