- Load MCBs:** Located at the bottom, these breakers distribute power to individual circuits such as lighting, outlets, and appliances. Each MCB is connected to the load terminals, which are considered the bottom incoming line for downstream circuits.
- Neutral and Earth Bars:** The neutral bar is isolated in subpanels, while the earth bar is bonded to the metallic enclosure.

Bottom connections often include neutral and earth terminations for outgoing circuits.

Wiring and Safety Considerations

- Color Coding:** Hot wires (phase) are typically black or red, neutral is white or gray, and ground is green or bare copper.
- Torque and Termination:** All connections should be torque-tightened according to manufacturer specifications to prevent loose connections and overheating.
- Isolation:** In sub-distribution units, neutral and ground should remain isolated to prevent circulating currents.
- Accessibility:** BS 7671 recommends that distribution boards be mounted a...
