EU Regulations: Compliance with RoHS and REACH ensures that cables meet hazardous substance limits and chemical safety requirements. LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen) jackets are recommended to reduce environmental impact and improve safety.

UK Regulations: The UKCA mark is mandatory for products sold in Great Britain, confirming compliance with UK Building Regulations and relevant British Standards.
