These joints appear dull, grainy, or rough and can cause intermittent connections, high resistance, and mechanical brittleness. Cold solder joints are typically caused by insufficient soldering temperature, improper heating time, or poor surface preparation. Identifying and correcting cold solder joints is critical for reliable electronic performance.
