□ Data Center Design: Hot Aisle & Cold Aisle - Length and Width Guidelines □ Aisle Length: → When racks or equipment cabinets are aligned to form a continuous aisle, the aisle should not exceed 16 meters in length. → If one end of the aisle is closed or has no personnel exit, the maximum allowable. Hot aisle/cold aisle layout can still be used in server rooms without raised floors: distinct hot and cold aisles can be created by rearranging server rack locations and then reconfiguring the ductwork above.
