Typically, modules are mounted directly on the distribution board or backplane, minimizing cable length to a few centimeters to ensure signal integrity and safety.
- 5. Local Electrical Codes:** Always follow local electrical regulations, which may specify maximum cable lengths, conduit requirements, and spacing for different types of installations. For residential setups, distances are usually within 1-5 meters, while industrial setups may allow longer runs if proper cable sizing and protection are used.
