

Do cable tray hangers need to be fitted with sleeves

Many standard cable tray hangers use rods, bolts, or clamps directly without sleeves, provided the rod diameter and material are sufficient to support the load. The NEC and DIN EN 61537 standards focus on proper support, spacing, and material selection rather than mandating sleeves.

Best Practices

- Ensure rod diameter is adequate (typically ≥ 8 mm for vertical runs) to prevent bending or sagging.
- Match material and coating of hangers and rods to the environment to avoid galvanic corrosion.
- Use sleeves or protective inserts if rods pass through metal brackets or if vibration and wear are concerns.
- Maintain proper spacing and secure attachment to structural elements to ensure safety and compliance with NEC 392.

Conclusion

While sleeves can enhance durability and load distribution, they are not universally required for cable tray hangers. Their use should be determined by the specific installation conditions, rod...
