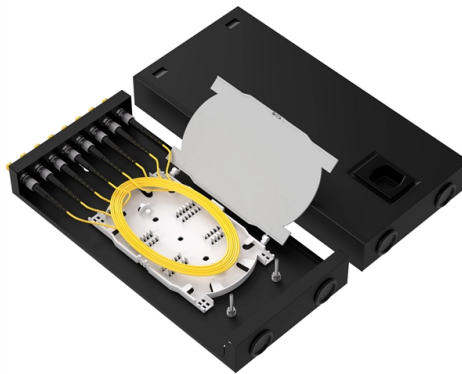

A router can act as an aggregation switch when: It supports Layer 2 switching or bridging in addition to routing. It can aggregate multiple uplinks from access switches or edge devices.
