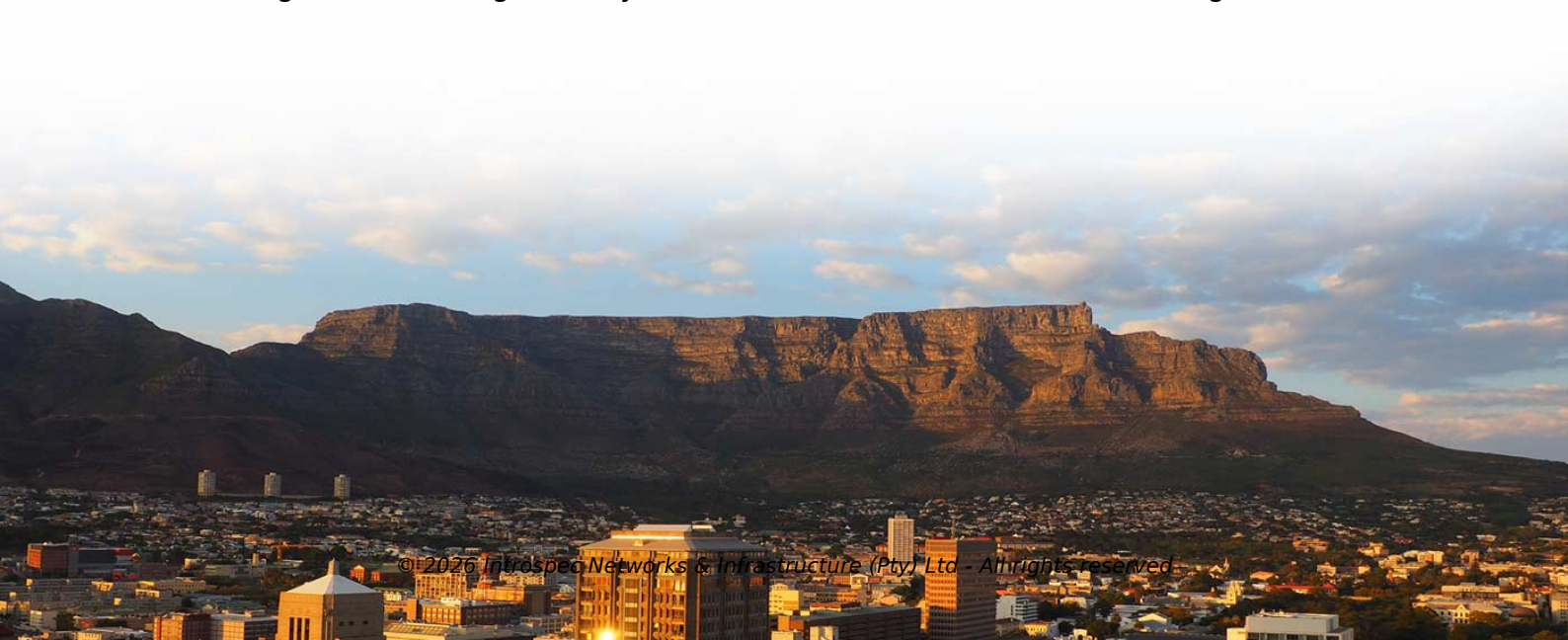


Does the pigtail need to be spliced How is it done

Once you've selected your pigtail, the bare fiber end needs to be permanently joined to the incoming cable fiber. The connector end plugs directly into active equipment, an ODF port, or a fiber splice. A fiber pigtail is a short length of optical fiber that comes with a high-quality, factory-polished connector already installed on one end, leaving a length of exposed glass on the other. Instead of building a connector from scratch in the field, you simply fuse the “bare” end of the pigtail to. A fiber pigtail is a single, short, usually tight-buffered, optical fiber that has an optical connector pre-installed on one end and a length of exposed fiber at the other end. The end of the pigtail is stripped and fusion spliced to a single fiber of a multi-fiber trunk. Splicing of pigtails to each fiber in the trunk "breaks out" the multi-fiber cable into its component fibers for connection to the end equipment.
