Cutting a Hole in an Electrical Box When standard knockouts do not align with your wiring plan, you may need to cut a new hole. First, de-energize the circuit by switching off the corresponding breaker and verify with a non-contact voltage tester to prevent shock. Wear safety glasses and gloves to protect against debris and sharp edges. For metal boxes, drill a small pilot hole, then use a hole saw or knockout punch at slow speed with light lubricant to prevent overheating. For plastic boxes, apply steady, moderate pressure to avoid cracking or melting. After cutting, remove burrs to prevent conductor damage and maintain safety and compliance (Engineer Fix).

Repairing Broken Screw Holes If a screw hole in a plastic outlet box is damaged, options include replacing the box or using repair clips like the G-Clip, which allows you to secure the box without full replacement. Ensure the box is properly mounted and supported to maintain stability (MRElectrician).

Handling Oversized Holes For old work boxes where the wall opening is slightly too large, you can often rely on the box's mounting ears and cover plates to secure the installation. If necessary, expand the drywall edges with joint compound to fill gaps, but if the box is stable and the cover plate fits, additional work may not be required (DIY Stack Exchange).

Selecting the Correct Hole Size When installing ceiling electrical boxes, hole saw size must match the box dimensions. Measure the box carefully and choose a hole saw that allows a snug fit without forcing the box into the opening. Precision ensures a professional, code-compliant installation and prevents damage to the surrounding material (Tools Advisers).

Covering Unused Knockouts Unused openings can be safely covered with knockout plugs made of plastic, steel, or nylon. These plugs prevent debris entry and maintain the box's protective function (Amazon).
