For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with stripes or other markings to maintain unique identification for each fiber. This system ensures proper splicing, testing, and maintenance, especially in high-density installations. Connectors and Conduits Connectors and conduits may also follow color conventions to match the fiber type: Single-mode connectors often have yellow boots. Multimode connectors may have beige (OM1/OM2) or aqua (OM3/OM4) boots. Conduits themselves are sometimes color-coded in large installations to indicate the type of fiber they carry, though this can vary by manufacturer and project requirements.
