

Grounding copper foil of distribution box



Overview

Ground conductors for all power distribution equipment, end-use equipment and all branch circuits, shall be insulated stranded copper conductors, color coded green or (a continuous) green color with 1 or more yellow stripes. Copper foil is generally used in protective grounding for equipotential bonding of movable or structural components such as door panels, side panels, and base plates. Functional grounding provides a stable reference potential for electronic circuits. Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. 26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used. But electrical system designs are becoming more complex, with smaller and more powerful devices in close proximity - and often under harsh conditions.
