

Horizontal Standards for Installing Distribution Boxes

Distribution boxes must be installed level and stable, with internal wiring arranged horizontally and vertically in neat, precise bundles to meet safety and regulatory standards.

Level and Stable Installation A distribution box must be firmly mounted and perfectly level to ensure safety and operational reliability. For boxes under 50 cm in height, the permissible vertical deviation is 1.5 mm, and for boxes 50 cm or taller, it is 3 mm. Accurate hole cutting for cable entry is essential, with smooth, burr-free openings and proper use of insulating bushings to prevent wire damage. Surface-mounted boxes should have tight conduit connections using locknuts to avoid exposure of internal wires.

Horizontal and Vertical Wiring Standards Inside the box, wires must be arranged neatly in horizontal and vertical lines, creating an organized and aesthetically pleasing layout. Straight sections should be smooth, and bends or corners must maintain a minimum radius of six times the wire's outer diameter. Grouped wires should be tied into bundles to prevent slack and tangling, ensuring both safety and ease of maintenance.

Wire Connections and Safety All wire connections must be firm and secure, using spring washers where required. Neutral and protective earth terminals must be properly connected to prevent the enclosure from becoming live during faults. Standard color coding for three-phase four-wire systems should be followed: Phase A - Yellow, Phase B - Green, Phase C - Red, Neutral - Light Blue, and Protective Earth - Yellow/Green bi-color. The Yellow/Green bi-color wire must not be used for any other purpose.

Additional Installation Considerations

Height: Typically, the bottom edge of a distribution box is installed around 1.5 m from the floor, though adjustments can be made for operational convenience with design approval.
