- Align the Fibers** Place the bare end of the pigtail and the incoming fiber into the fusion splicer. The splicer aligns the fibers automatically for optimal light transmission.
- Perform the Splice**

Fusion Splicing: The splicer melts the fiber ends together, creating a permanent, low-loss joint. This method is preferred for high-performance networks.

Mechanical Splicing: Fibers are held in precise alignment using a gel or mechanical fixture. This is faster but may have slightly higher insertion loss.

Protect the Splice

- Slide a protective sleeve over the splice and shrink it using a heat source to prevent...
