Step 4: Terminate and Connect Insert the pigtail connectors into the adapter ports of the distribution box, matching the connector type (LC, SC, or ST) with the network equipment. If connecting to multiple devices, use patch cords to link the distribution box ports to the respective equipment. Lock connectors securely to maintain a stable connection and prevent signal loss.

Step 5: Cable Management and Testing Organize excess fiber using cable ties, velcro straps, or built-in cable management trays to avoid tight bends and stress on the fibers. Test the connection using an OTDR or visual fault locator to verify signal integrity.
