

# How to connect vertical cable trays to horizontal cable trays

This method does not always require a tee fitting, as the software can create a connection between the horizontal tray's added connector and the vertical tray's end connector.

Installation Considerations Spacing and clearance are critical when connecting vertical and horizontal trays. Minimum vertical spacing between floor-mounted trays or between upper and lower trays should be at least 150 millimeters to allow for maintenance, heat dissipation, and future expansion. Horizontal spacing between power and signal trays should generally be no less than 0.5 meters to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI), though shielding can reduce this requirement to 0.3 meters. Support and stability are also important. Vertical trays require secure hanging rod supports to prevent sagging and maintain structural integrity, while horizontal trays typically have support spans ranging from 1.5 to 3 meters depending on cable weight and tray type.
