

# How to determine if a switch's optical port is faulty

**Step 3: Monitor Digital Diagnostic Monitoring (DDM) Metrics** Most modern SFPs support DDM, which provides real-time sensor data. Use: `show interface transceiver detail` Key metrics to check: Tx Power (dBm) – transmitted optical power Rx Power (dBm) – received optical power Temperature (°C) Voltage (V) Bias Current (mA) Compare these values against the SFP's specifications. Rx power below the “Low Warning” or “Low Alarm” threshold may indicate a weak signal due to dirty connectors, damaged fiber, or a failing laser.

**Step 4: Inspect Interface Error Counters** Run: `show interface counters errors` Increasing input errors, CRC errors, or alignment errors often point to a failing optic or cable. If errors are only on one side, the problem may be at the remote end.

**Step 5: Physical Inspection and Cleaning** Inspect fiber connectors for dust or damage. Clean connectors with lint-free wipes or fiber cleaning tools. Ensure the correct fiber type is used: single-mode (SM) for long distances, multimode (MM) for short runs.

**Step 6: Swap and Test** Replace the suspect SFP with a known good module of the same type...
