

How to lay armored optical cables

Protection of Cable Ends: Cap or tape exposed cable ends to prevent moisture ingress, especially for outdoor or long-term installations.

Routing Considerations: Keep armored cables away from electrical wiring to avoid interference. For underground installations, ensure sufficient burial depth and proper drainage.
