

How to make an optical fiber splice tray

A fiber optic splice tray is a storage and management component designed to hold spliced fibers securely inside enclosures, patch panels, or closures. Its main purpose is mechanical protection, maintaining proper bend radius, preventing stress, and organizing fibers for easy maintenance ().

Trays can accommodate fusion or mechanical splices and are often layered or pivoted inside enclosures for accessibility ().

Tools and Materials Needed

- Fiber optic strippers and cleavers
- Fusion splicer or mechanical splice connectors
- Heat shrink sleeves or splice protection sleeves
- Fiber optic cleaning kit (lint-free wipes, isopropyl alcohol)
- Safety glasses and well-lit workspace
- Labeling materials and tray blanking plates for organization ()

Step-by-Step Assembly

Prepare the Fiber Cable

Strip the outer jacket using fiber optic strippers, exposing the inner fibers without damaging them. Carefully remove buffer tubes to access individual fibers, avoiding microbends or breaks ().

Clean and Cleave Fibers

Clean each fiber end with alcohol wipes and lint-free cloths to remove dust and contaminants. Use a precision cleaver to create a flat, perpendicular end face, essential for low-loss splicing ().

Splice the Fibers

For fusion splicing, align the fiber ends in a fusion splicer and weld them with an electric arc. For mechanical splicing, insert fibers into a mechanical splice connector with index-matching gel to align them ().

Protect the splice with a heat shrink sleeve or protective cover.

Organize Fibers in the Tray

Place spliced fibers into the tray slots or compartments, following the manufacturer's routing paths. Maintain proper bend radius and avoid pinching or stress on fibers. Use tray blanking plates or clips to secure fibers and prevent movement ().

Label and Secure

Label each fiber or splice for easy identification and future maintenance. Stack or pivot trays inside the enclosure...
