Mechanical Splicing Alternative

Mechanical splicing can be used for temporary or emergency connections. It involves aligning fiber ends in a specialized housing with an index-matching gel. While faster and requiring less equipment, mechanical splices have higher signal loss (0.2–0.75 dB) and are less reliable long-term compared to fusion splicing.
