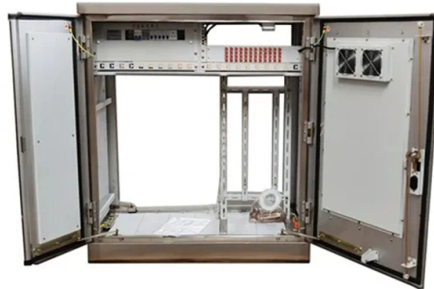


How to waterproof cable trays on roofs
