

Installation Instructions for 800mm Deep Cold Aisles in Computer Rooms



AI Overview

Cold aisles with 800mm deep cabinets should be installed with proper spacing, perforated tiles, and optional containment to optimize airflow and cooling efficiency.

Cabinet and Aisle Layout For 800mm deep cabinets (600mm standard plus 200mm side space), ensure that each cabinet has sufficient installation and wiring space. The side compartments can house network and optical cables, keeping them organized and hidden while improving reliability and aesthetics. Place cabinets in rows facing each other to form the cold aisle, with the front of the cabinets receiving cold air from perforated floor tiles.

Aisle Width and Length Minimum cold aisle width: 1.2 meters (allowing two full tiles between cabinet fronts for optimal airflow), .Maximum aisle length: 16 meters for continuous rows; reduce to 6 meters if one end is closed or lacks a personnel exit for safety .Ensure service clearance behind cabinets, typically up to 30 inches, to meet maintenance and floor loading requirements .

Perforated Tile Placement Install perforated tiles in the cold aisle directly in front of each cabinet row. For single cabinets, two fully perforated tiles are recommended; for multiple cabinets, a continuous row of perforated tiles ensures uniform cold air delivery . This helps maintain consistent temperature and prevents hot spots.

Cold Aisle Containment To improve cooling efficiency and prevent mixing of hot and cold air: Cold Aisle Containment (CAC): Enclose the cold aisle with barriers or sliding doors to direct cold air to server intakes . Hot Aisle Containment (HAC): Alternatively, enclose the hot aisle to isolate exhaust air. Use modular, rack-attached systems with transparent panels for visibility and service access .Ensure containment systems are compatible with ceiling height and allow for cable pathways and future expansion .
