Connecting Splice-Free Cables Splice-free cables typically use mechanical splices or pre-terminated connectors:

- Mechanical splices** align two fiber ends using a precision alignment device and an index-matching gel to reduce reflection and signal loss. Insert the fibers into the splice holder, ensuring the ends meet precisely, then secure the clamp. Typical insertion loss is around 0.3–0.5 dB.
- Pre-terminated cables** come with factory-installed connectors. Simply insert the connector into the mating port or adapter, ensuring proper alignment and a clean connection. These are ideal for quick deployment and temporary connections.

Testing and Verification After installation, always test the connection using an insertion loss meter or OTDR to verify signal quality. Check for excessive loss or back reflection, and if necessary, clean the connectors or realign the fibers.

Best Practices Avoid touching the fiber ends with bare hands. Keep fibers straight and avoid sharp bends. Use proper protective sleeves or...
