Inspect trays for coating damage before installation and repair any breaches to prevent corrosion. Bundle and balance cables evenly to distribute weight and reduce stress on supports. Follow recognized standards such as BS EN 61537 for tray systems and BS 6946 for channel supports to ensure safety and compliance.

Maintenance and Troubleshooting Periodically check for sagging, loose supports, or corrosion and tighten or replace hardware as needed. Ensure that bends and fittings maintain the minimum radius to avoid cable strain. Replace damaged s...
