Deployment in a Fiber Link In a typical fiber network, placing a terminal box at both ends ensures:

- Feeder End (e.g., OLT or central office):** The terminal box organizes multiple outgoing fibers, provides strain relief, and allows easy access for testing and patching.
- Subscriber End (e.g., premises or MDU):** The terminal box terminates the drop cable, presents adapter ports for ONTs/ONUs, and protects fibers from handling or environmental damage.

This setup is common in FTTH, FTTB, and small network deployments, where each terminal box acts as a demarcation point, optical management hub, and protection enclosure.

- Port Capacity:** Choose boxes with sufficient ports for current and future connections (e.g., 4-48 ports for residential or small business networks).
- Mounting Options:** Wall-mounted, pole-mounted, or rack-mounted depending on location and space constraints.
