

Professional splicing of optical cables

Fiber optic cables can be spliced using either fusion splicing for permanent low-loss connections or mechanical splicing for temporary or quick repairs.

Fusion Splicing Steps

Prepare the Cable: Strip 3–5 cm of the outer jacket and remove the buffer coating to expose the bare fiber. Clean the fiber with an IPA-soaked swab to remove oils and debris, avoiding direct contact with the glass surface.

Cleave the Fiber: Use a precision fiber cleaver to create a clean, perpendicular cut on each fiber end. A proper cleave ensures minimal signal loss and prevents splice failure.

Fuse the Fibers: Activate the splicer to generate an electric arc that melts and fuses the fiber ends together, forming a continuous optical path.

Protect the Splice: Place the fused fiber into a protective splice sleeve or tray to prevent mechanical damage and environmental exposure.

Test the Splice: Measure insertion loss and back reflection to ensure the splice meets network standards, typically below 0.1 dB for high-quality fusion splices.

Mechanical Splicing Steps

Prepare the Fiber: Strip the cable jacket and buffer to expose the bare fiber. Clean the fiber thoroughly.

Cleave the Fiber: Use a fiber cleaver to create a smooth, perpendicular end on each fiber.

Insert into Mechanical Splice Unit: Place the fibers into the mechanical splice housing. Use an index-matching gel or epoxy to bridge the microscopic gap between fiber ends, allowing light to pass with minimal reflection.

Secure the Splice: Lock the fibers in place within the splice unit. The housing provides mechanical protection and maintains alignment.

Enclose and Protect: Place the completed mechanical splice into a splice tray or closure to shield it from moisture and physical stress.

Best Practices

Always use clean tools and handle fibers carefully to avoid contamination or breakage. Maintain proper bending radius (>30 mm) to prevent fiber stress. Label a...
