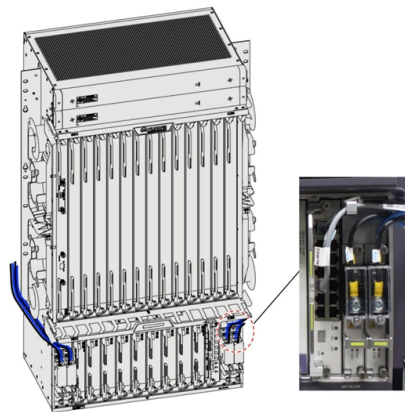


Requirements for the outlet of secondary distribution boxes

Secondary distribution boxes must be installed with proper clearances, accessible work space, secure grounding, and compliance with applicable electrical codes to ensure safe operation and maintenance.

Location and Clearance Requirements
Secondary distribution boxes should be installed in dry, accessible areas with adequate ventilation and at an appropriate height, typically around 1.5 meters for ease of operation and maintenance. Clearances around the box are critical for safety and operational access:

- Small secondary splice boxes (24" x 36" or smaller):** Maintain 3 feet on short sides and 2 feet on one long side.
- Larger boxes (3' x 5' or larger):** Follow similar clearance standards as indicated in detailed installation tables.
- Foreign substructures:** Keep 1 foot around and 6 feet below the enclosure free of obstructions.
- Hazardous locations:** Maintain additional clearances from flammable liquids or gases, treating such containers as combustible walls.

Work Space and Accessibility
A clear and level work area is required around the secondary distribution box to allow safe operation, maintenance, and removal of covers or equipment. Obstructions, elevation changes, or encroachments (except standard curbs) are not allowed in the work space. Adequate space must also be provided for:

- Drawing in and connecting cables
- Withdrawing circuit breakers for maintenance
- Delivery and installation of additional switchgear if needed

Enclosure and Protection
The distribution box enclosure protects internal components from water, dust, and mechanical damage. Key requirements include:

- Material:** Steel for durability in harsh environments or plastic for indoor use.
- IP/NEMA rating:** Ensure the enclosure rating matches environmental conditions, with higher ratings for outdoor or industrial applications.
- Internal components:** Include circuit breakers, busbars, terminal block...
