Installation Height and Accessibility The bottom edge of the box is typically installed 1.5–1.8 meters above the ground, which allows convenient operation and inspection. The mounting must be firm and stable, using brackets or screws to prevent tilting or movement due to vibration or impact. NEC standards recommend a maximum panelboard height of 2 meters and a working clearance of at least 30 inches wide, 36 inches deep, and 2 meters high in front of the panel. Spacing and Layout Sub-distribution boxes should be installed near concentrated electrical equipment or loads. The distance between the main distribution box and sub-distribution boxes should not exceed 30 meters, and the distance to controlled fixed equipment should not exceed 3 meters. Ensure enough space for two people to work simultaneously and avoid obstacles, shrubs, or debris around the box. Safety and Protection All metal parts, electrical boards, and appliances must be properly grounded. Use high-temperature resistant copper wires with cross-sectional areas suitable for the load. Cable inlets and cover joints should be well-sealed to prevent exposure. Each circuit should have protection devices such as breakers, fuses, or surge protectors.
