Do not exceed the specified pulling tension; use swivel grips and compatible lubricants to reduce stress on the cable. Prevent twisting or torsion during installation; anti-twisting devices are recommended. Dispose of fiber scraps carefully in sealed containers to avoid skin punctures or contamination. Maintain a clean work area; avoid food, beverages, and smoking near fiber handling zones.

Chemical and Adhesive Safety Splicing and termination often involve epoxies, solvents, and cleaning agents. Follow Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for each chemical, including proper ventilation, protective gloves, and eye protection. Avoid prolonged inhalation and contact with skin or eyes, and store flammable substances away from heat sources.

Regulatory Compliance Personnel must comply with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.268, National Electrical Safety Code (NESC), National Electrical Code (NEC/NFPA 70), and local regulations. Companies should enforce training programs for all employees handling fiber optic systems, ensuring only authorized personnel perform installation, maintenance, or r...
