Laser Safety Laser beams used in fiber optics are often invisible and can cause serious retinal damage. Never look directly into a fiber or laser source. Use power meters or diffused light for testing, and ensure all laser safety protocols are followed.

Mechanical and Installation Safety Cables must be handled carefully to avoid exceeding minimum bending radius, pulling tension, or twisting limits, which can damage fibers and create hazards during installation. Anti-twisting devices and proper lubricants should be used to reduce mechanical stress.
