

Safety Standards for Workshop Electrical Distribution Boxes

Workshop electrical distribution boxes must comply with recognized safety standards, including proper material selection, hierarchical power distribution, protective devices, grounding, ventilation, and labeling to ensure safe operation.

Material and Construction Requirements Distribution boxes should be made of steel plates (1.2–2.0 mm thick) or flame-retardant insulating materials to provide fire resistance and mechanical durability. All internal electrical appliances must be mounted on metal or insulating boards, securely fastened, and electrically bonded to the box body. Non-electrified metal parts should be connected to ground or neutral through dedicated terminals to prevent electric shock.

Power Distribution and Hierarchy Workshops should implement three-level power distribution: a general distribution box, branch distribution boxes, and switch boxes. Power and lighting circuits must be separated to prevent overloads and simplify maintenance. The main distribution box should be located close to the power supply and in areas where electrical equipment is concentrated for efficient control.

Protective Devices All switches and circuit breakers must provide short-circuit and overload protection, with rated values compatible with the connected load. Equipment must have an interrupting rating sufficient for the system voltage and current to safely break fault currents. Regular inspection and maintenance are essential to ensure continued safe operation.

Installation and Ventilation Distribution boxes must be firmly mounted on stable surfaces, avoiding temporary or weak supports like wooden plugs. Adequate clearance and ventilation should be provided to allow natural air circulation and prevent overheating. Incoming and outgoing cables should enter from the lower end, with protective rings and waterproof bends to prevent mechanical damage.
