Cold Joints in Concrete
Definition: A cold joint in concrete occurs when new concrete is poured against partially set concrete, creating a weak seam that can compromise structural integrity .

- Apply bonding agent: Brush, roll, or spray the agent onto the cleaned surface to create a strong adhesive layer
- Mix and apply patch: Follow manufacturer instructions for mixing mortars or epoxy, then compact the new concrete against the old to avoid air pockets
- Finish and cure: Smooth the surface with a trowel, cover with damp material, and avoid traffic for at least 7 days to ensure proper curing
- Optional reinforcement: Use dowels or mechanical connectors for structural slabs to enhance load transfer

Cold Solder Joints
Definition: A cold solder joint occurs when solder fails to melt completely or bond properly to a PCB pad or component lead, resulting in weak electrical connections .

Essential Tools and Materials:

- Soldering iron with adjustable temperature to ensure proper heat
- Solder wire (preferably lead-free or as required by the project) and flux for better adhesion
- Cleaning tools: isopropyl alcohol and brushes to remove oxidation
- Tweezers or clamps to hold components steady during soldering

- Prepare surfaces: Clean PCB pads and component leads to remove dirt or oxidation
