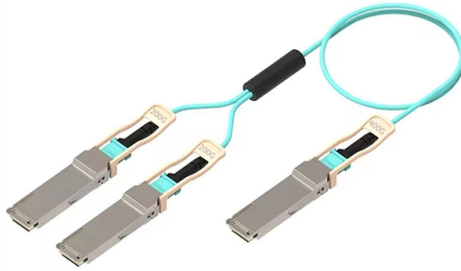


Standard Capacity of Distribution Boxes in Residential Buildings
