 - S: Single-pole switch
 - S3: Triple-pole switch
 - GFCI: Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter
 - RCD: Residual Current DeviceThese markings help electricians understand the protection mechanism and control type.
- Trip Characteristics** Some breakers include markings for trip speed or curve type (B, C, D), which define how quickly the breaker responds to overcurrent conditions. This is important for coordinating protection across circuits.
- Safety and Compliance Marks** Look for UL, CE, or other certification marks, which indicate compliance with safety standards. Labels may also include the last inspection date or maintenance notes.

Best Practices for Labeling

- Legibility:** Use durable, smudge-resistant labels or a label maker rather than masking tape or handwritten notes.
- Up-to-date Information:** Update labels whenever circuits are added, removed, or modified to prevent hazards.
- Single-Line Diagrams:** Maintain a clear diagram showing all circuits and switches, which helps verify correct isolation points and reduces the risk of shock or arc flash.
- Room-by-Room Identification:** Test each circuit with a voltage tester or circuit finder...
