

The joints of the cable trays need to be secured

The cable tray needs to be anchored at the support closest to the midpoint between the expansion joints with hold down clamps and secured by expansion guides at all other support locations. The expansion guides allow the cable tray to slide back and forth as it contracts and expands. Choosing the right one depends on project conditions, load. The National Electrical Code (NEC) is the ultimate authority for any cable tray installation. You should consider it as a series of instructions that make the buildings resistant to. The cable trays are screwed together using connector holes with the appropriate fastening material. The selection of the matching cable tray system is dependent on the area of use and the cable load
