Role of the Neutral Wire The neutral wire, also called the grounded conductor, serves as the return path for electrical current under normal operation, completing the circuit back to the source, typically a center-tapped transformer. It is maintained at or near ground potential throughout its run, providing a stable reference for the system voltage. Unlike the equipment grounding conductor (EGC), which only carries current during a fault, the neutral wire is a current-carrying conductor during normal operation. Grounding Requirements In a standard residential or commercial setup, the neutral wire is intentionally connected to the earth at the main service panel. This connection, known as system bonding, is achieved by connecting the neutral bus bar to the panel enclosure or grounding bus bar using a main bonding jumper (MBJ). This establishes a zero-voltage reference point and ensures that overcurrent protective devices operate correctly during ground faults.
