

Trunk line access to PBX



AI Overview

Trunk lines provide the essential connection between a PBX system and external networks, enabling inbound and outbound calls. What is a Trunk Line? A trunk line is a communication pathway that links a PBX (Private Branch Exchange) to external networks such as the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN), VoIP providers, or another PBX system (). Unlike individual telephone lines that connect directly to a single phone, a trunk can carry multiple simultaneous calls, making it more efficient for business communication. Trunks can be physical (analog or digital lines like ISDN) or virtual (SIP or IAX over IP networks) ().

Types of Trunk Lines

Analog Trunks: Traditional two-wire circuits (TIP and RING) connecting the PBX to the CO (Central Office). They use loop start or ground start signaling to manage call initiation and termination ().

Digital Trunks: Include ISDN or T1/E1 lines, which can carry multiple voice channels over a single connection, offering better call quality and signaling features.

SIP Trunks: Internet-based virtual trunks using the Session Initiation Protocol (SIP) to transmit voice over IP. They are scalable, cost-effective, and configurable with provider credentials, codecs, and routing rules ().

IAX Trunks: Used mainly in Asterisk-based PBX systems, efficient for NAT traversal and multiplexing multiple calls over a single UDP stream ().

Accessing and Configuring Trunks

To access trunk lines on a PBX:

Administrative Access: Log into the PBX administration interface with sufficient privileges ().

Trunk Module: Navigate to the PBX configuration section, then to connectivity or trunks. Here, you can add, edit, or remove trunk configurations.

Configuration Parameters: For SIP trunks, this includes the provider's SIP server address, port, transport protocol (UDP, TCP, TLS), authentication credentials, and registration settings (). For analog trunks, loop or ground start signaling and line voltage settings are configured ().
