

Wall-mounted router fiber optic

Step 4: Mount the Enclosure Drill holes at the marked points, insert anchors if needed, and secure the enclosure with screws. Double-check with a level to ensure the enclosure is straight. Proper alignment is crucial for cable management and long-term stability.

Step 5: Run and Manage Fiber Cables Feed the incoming fiber optic cable into the enclosure through the designated entry port. Coil any excess fiber inside the enclosure, maintaining the minimum bend radius. Avoid kinks or sharp bends, as fiber strands are fragile and can break easily. Use a fiber optic termination kit if you need to attach connectors.

Step 6: Connect the Router to the ONT Attach the fiber patch cable from the ONT to the wall-mounted router or enclosure. Ensure the connectors are clean and properly seated. For GPON networks, SC/APC connectors (green) are standard. After connecting, power on the router and verify the light levels are within the recommended range (-8 dBm to -27...
