For example, the model GYGZL03 can be interpreted as: GY (outdoor optical cable), G (metal heavy-duty reinforcement), Z (self-supporting structure), L (aluminum sheath), 03 (specific outer layer configuration, e.g., polyethylene sleeve without armor).
