They often use vibration-resistant connectors like E2000 with IP65 or IP67 protection ratings to ensure durability and minimal maintenance. Modern tunnel cables can support scalable bandwidths from 1 Gbit/s to 100 Gbit/s, allowing future upgrades without replacing the cabling.

Installation and Maintenance Fiber in tunnels is typically installed in existing ducts or conduits, sometimes repurposing old copper cable pathways. Freeform pliable ribbon cables are preferred for their smaller diameter and weight, which simplifies installation in confined spaces. Installation teams use modular splice systems and secure cables every 50 centimeters with elastic clamps to prevent micromotion. Maintenance involves annual visual inspections and metrological checks every two years, with critical sections checked every six months.
