

What is the standard height for outdoor optical cables

Private property or pedestrian areas: Clearances can be lower, often around 8 to 10 feet, but must comply with local safety codes and avoid interference with pedestrian traffic.

Crossings over rivers, bridges, or railways: Special considerations may require higher clearances, often 20 feet or more, to account for dynamic loads and environmental factors.

Installation Considerations

Clamping intervals: Vertical installations should be clamped frequently to prevent the cable weight from exceeding the maximum long-term load.

Service loops: Extra cable should be left at street crossings or junctions (e.g., 100 feet per 1,000 feet of cable) to facilitate maintenance.

Segregation from other utilities: Fiber cables should be separated from heavy copper or power cables to avoid mechanical stress and bend radius violations.
